#### **About ICVA**

- ICVA Members: ICVA has over 100 members active in humanitarian response across the world. Members are humanitarian NGOs, large and small, secular and faith-based, national and international, joined through a common commitment to principled humanitarian action. - **ICVA focus areas:** Based on its <u>ICVA Strategy 2019-2021</u>, ICVA promotes and facilitates NGO engagement in the development of the humanitarian sector, with a focus on Forced Migration, Financing, Coordination, and Navigating Change:cross cutting issues.

#### **Membership Criteria and Membership Fees**

ICVA membership is open to registered non-profit organisations with missions consistent with the mission of ICVA: to influence humanitarian policy and practice to make humanitarian action more principled and effective. The annual membership fee ranges from CHF 500-12,000 a year. Guidelines for deciding membership fees are based on annual budget/expenses

You will find more information about the criteria and the fee schedule in this document.

It is important that applicants for membership have sufficient capacity to enable them to participate in ICVA governance and workspaces, and to pay the annual membership fee. ICVA is not a donor organisation so is unable to provide financial aid to members.

#### **Benefits to Members**

#### Through ICVA, members:

- **influence global policy and practice** through access to UN and inter-governmental humanitarian policy and decision makers.
- Participate in collective and amplified NGO advocacy on humanitarian issues.
- Bring the **field realities** of humanitarian practice to global and regional forums.
- Participate in the IASC mechanisms, through ICVA's seat as a standing invitee to the IASC.
- **Network, connect and exchange** with a diverse global NGO membership, and other humanitarian stakeholders.
- Stay informed on key debates and issues relevant to operations.
- Share information, expertise, information and resources.
- Shape the strategic direction of ICVA, be eligible to serve on the ICVA Board, and vote at the ICVA General Assembly.

#### **Membership application**

When you are ready to apply to become a member of ICVA, please request a Membership Application Form from the <a href="mailto:secretariat@icvanetwork.org">secretariat@icvanetwork.org</a>. A completed Application Form can be submitted at any time, with the supporting documents and an application fee of CHF 75. The Membership Committee of the ICVA Board reviews new applications for membership every few months.

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR MEMBERSHIP**

## A. Categories of Organisation Eligible to Become Members of ICVA

There are three categories of organisation that are eligible to become a member of ICVA

- International voluntary agencies or international non-governmental organisations (NGOs)
  whose operations extend outside their country of origin. This category also includes families
  or federations of NGOs that share a common name, but that have chapters or operations in
  different countries.
- 2. Consortia, networks, and groups of different NGOs that have joined together to enhance the effectiveness of their work. Such groups may represent NGOs from one or more countries or they may be regional or global in scope.
- 3. National voluntary agencies or national non-governmental organisations, (NGOs) that operate only within their organisation's country of origin and have demonstrated a commitment to translating their work to the international level; or have specific expertise that will assist ICVA in achieving its mission.

## B. Organisations Eligible for Observer Status

An NGO that wishes to participate in the ICVA network but which, because of constitutional constraints or reasons of principle, cannot be associated with the views and/or positions adopted by ICVA, may apply for Observer status.

## C. Organisations Eligible for Affiliate Membership

The ICVA Affiliate membership category is for academic and research institutes that have existing activities of a human rights/humanitarian nature or existing activities of benefit to NGOs. Affiliate membership provides a means to make better links between their work and the work of ICVA members.

## **Independence of Member Organisations**

Member organisations retain their independence, including the right of withdrawal from ICVA.

For the purpose of these ICVA membership criteria, the term "non-governmental organisation" (NGO) signifies any association, organisation, or other entity that:

- i. is an independent body established by a group of private individuals or organisations;
- ii. has non-governmental and non-profit legal status in its country of incorporation; or is hosted by an organisation that has non-governmental and non-profit legal status in its country of incorporation;
- iii. is non-partisan and operates without discrimination with regard to race, nationality, gender, political, or religious conviction or social and economic background; and
- iv. has human rights/humanitarian programmes and/or activities that are consistent with the objectives of ICVA as described in its Mission Statement.

## **MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA**

An organisation applying for membership of ICVA will be assessed against the following criteria. The organisation should:

- 1. Be an independent body established by a group of private individuals or organisations.
- 2. Have non-governmental, non-profit legal status in its country of incorporation.
- 3. Be non-partisan (operate without discrimination in regard to race, nationality, gender, political or religious conviction or social and economic background).
- 4. Have human rights/humanitarian programmes and/or activities that are consistent with the purposes of ICVA as described in ICVA's Statutes (Article II) and Mission Statement.
- 5. Be governed by an independent, voluntary, and active board of directors.
- 6. Have a sustainable level of financial support.
- 7. Have a record of financial responsibility and accountability.
- 8. Have a record of accomplishing its objectives.
- 9. State its commitment to participate in ICVA's activities as outlined in the ICVA Strategic Plan.
- 10. Acknowledge that they are not listed on the UN Security Council List, neither are their affiliates or any of their individuals.
- 11. Demonstrate, in all relevant situations, a commitment to:
  - a) Collaboration with other NGOs and/or partner agencies, in line with the *Principles of Partnership* of the Global Humanitarian Platform.
  - b) Humanitarian principles, including the Code of Conduct for the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement and NGOs in Disaster Relief.
  - c) Prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse as guided by the *Statement of Commitment on Eliminating Sexual Exploitation and Abuse by UN and Non-UN Personnel.*
  - d) Quality and accountability in humanitarian action, including use of the Sphere *Humanitarian Charter and Minimum Standards in Disaster Response*.

An organisation applying for Observer status will be assessed against the ICVA membership criteria and should follow the procedure for applying for membership of ICVA. The applicant also needs to specify the relevant paragraphs in its statutes, constitution, founding charter or similar document, explaining why it is unable to become a Member. Observer organisations receive full access to the ICVA website and documents, meetings, and participation at General Assemblies. However, they do not have the right to vote or hold office.

An organisation applying for Affiliate membership will be assessed against the ICVA membership criteria and should follow the procedure for applying for membership of ICVA. The applicant also needs to provide confirmation that it is a research institution affiliated with an academic institution and is independent from any government, intergovernmental organisations, and UN agencies. Affiliate members receive full access to the ICVA website and documents, meetings, and participation at General Assemblies. However, they do not have the right to vote or hold office.

#### Effective from 1 January 2005

## **Principles**

- 1. As a membership organisation, ICVA exists to serve its NGO members. Members thus have a responsibility to support ICVA through the payment of Membership Dues.
- 2. Every agency that is a Member, Observer or Affiliate in ICVA shall pay Membership Dues on an annual basis. ICVA's financial year runs from 1 January until 31 December.
- 3. The Membership Dues are based on a Membership Dues Structure determined by the ICVA Board (in accordance with Article VI of the ICVA Statutes). The ICVA Board shall confirm the applicable dues category for new member agencies. The ICVA Board shall also confirm into which category current ICVA Members, Observers, and Affiliates fall at the time when this structure comes into effect, in accordance with the definitions provided in this document.
- 4. ICVA's Membership Dues Structure is made up of six categories. An ICVA member agency will be placed in a category, regardless of location, according to:
  - the member agency's annual budget and structure; and
  - the status of membership in ICVA (Member, Observer or Affiliate)
- 5. Definition of Categories: Members and Affiliates fall into categories I to VI based on their annual budget. Observers fall into category II, regardless of annual budget.
- 6. Non-payment of Membership Dues can lead to suspension and termination of membership in accordance with the ICVA Statutes (Article VII of the ICVA Statutes).
- 7. Member agencies can allocate funds for the payment of Membership Dues through their operational activities. For example, funding for field projects could incorporate a budget line "international communications and network activities," a line item that can also be used to make a contribution towards ICVA.

## APPLICATION PROCEDURE

#### What Applicants should do:

A completed *Application for Membership of ICVA* form should be sent to the ICVA Secretariat with the following documents in English:

- 1. Statutes, constitution, founding charter, or similar document;
- 2. Proof of non-governmental and non-profit legal status;
- 3. Two most recent annual reports and audited financial statements, including sources of income and current donors;
- 4. Composition and term of executive body (board of directors or equivalent), including names and institutional affiliations;
- 5. Confirmation of payment of the application fee by bank transfer to ICVA of Swiss francs (CHF) 75.00 (not including bank charges); and
- 6. If your organisation has committed to any additional codes of conduct or similar documents, or if you have been accredited by a quality/accountability organisation, please send a copy of the code or standard with your application or supply an Internet address.
- 7. Once approved for membership each member agency will confirm in writing the person(s) that will act as its representative(s) to ICVA

#### What ICVA will do:

- 1. The ICVA Secretariat will review the complete application for membership against the criteria, check references as provided in the application, and may request additional information.
- 2. The Secretariat will make a recommendation to ICVA's Board. The Board will consider the application by email or at its next meeting. The Board meets at least twice a year.
- 3. In assessing the application, the Board will take into account its responsibility to uphold ICVA's mission and purpose and the degree to which the applicant will strengthen the work of ICVA.
- 4. The Board will approve, reject, or defer the application, based on a majority vote. The Board's decision is final.
- 5. The applicant will be informed by the Secretariat of the Board's decision and, if applicable, the reasons why the application was rejected or deferred.
- 6. If membership is approved, the Secretariat will send a formal acknowledgement, with a membership package and an invoice for membership dues, in line with the *ICVA Membership Dues Structure*.
