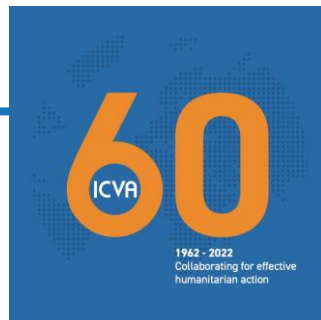

- ICVA was established in 1962
- Our 150+ members work in 160+ countries. They include NGOs large and small, secular and faith-based, national and international - DIVERSITY
- ICVA Secretariat is present in Geneva, Africa (Nairobi & Dakar), Asia (Bangkok) and Middle East & North Africa (Jordan), Latin America (Mexico) - OUTREACH

- Diversity of membership
- Only global humanitarian NGO network
- Outreach to 8'000 NGOs
- Operational footprint of members = 20 billions USD
- Over 50% of members with HQ in Global South)

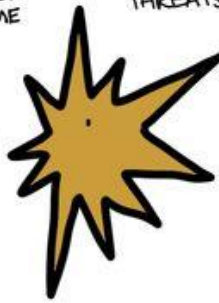

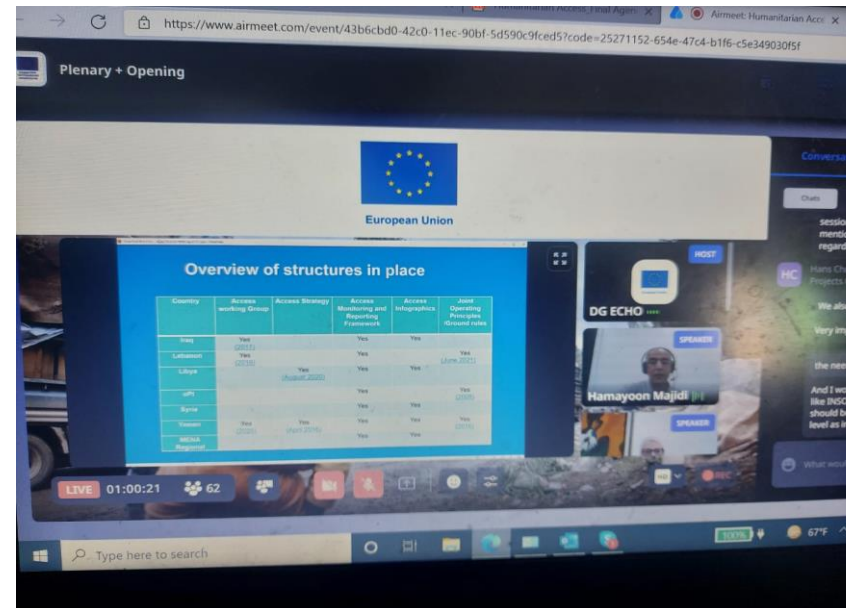
Key Achievements

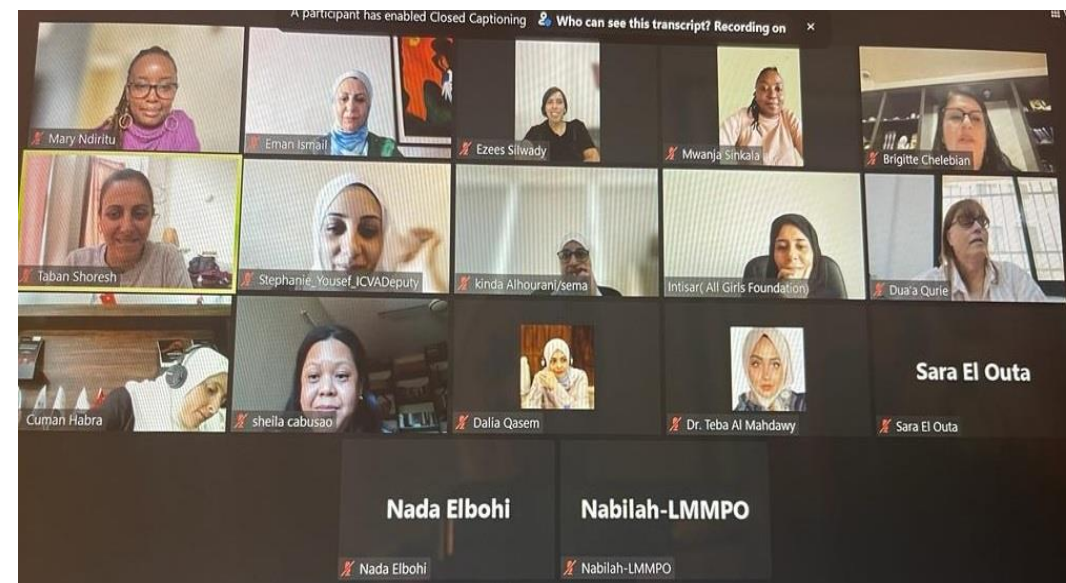

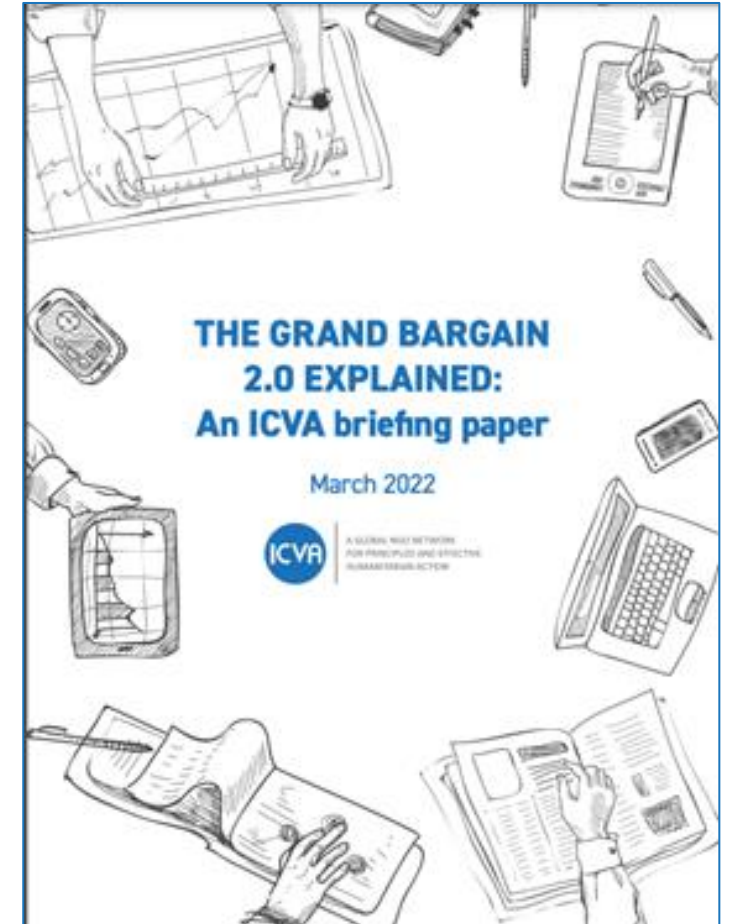

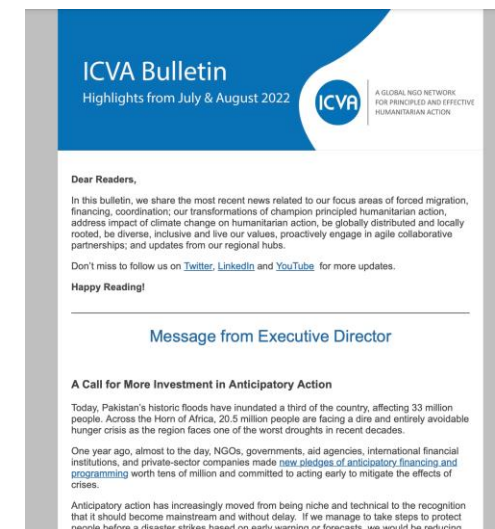
