
Pooled funding has become in recent years one of the go-to solutions to enhance the effectiveness of humanitarian action. The 2016 report of the High-Level Panel on Humanitarian Financing identified NGO-led and OCHA's country-based pooled funds as an efficient solution to provide more support to national first responders. The Norwegian Refugee Council in its 2022 report "Pooled Funds: The New Humanitarian Silver Bullet?" highlighted the potential of these funding mechanisms to rapidly provide agile funding, support localization, reduce administrative burdens and enhance coordination. Due to their success, the numbers of funds and levels of financing managed by them has significantly increased over recent years. The proliferation of funds and their weight in terms of humanitarian financing has led to increased attention to their impact and potential, with several studies and lessons learnt exercises published.

A report commissioned by ICVA, called "Pooled Funding at a Crossroads" considers questions like: What does the current literature on pooled funds focus on? What are the lessons learnt? Are there any knowledge gaps? The report concludes there are still gaps in research and knowledge on this very important topic.

Drawing on the findings of this report, this event co-hosted by Switzerland, ICVA and HERE-Geneva invites NGOs, UN agencies and donors to reflect on the humanitarian pooled fund mechanisms and explore avenues to enhance the efficiency, impact of and access to pooled funds to the benefit of people affected by crisis.
