Freezing US development and humanitarian aid

Analysis of the survey results



CONTEXT



On January 20, 2025, an executive order on the reevaluation of U.S. foreign aid (Reevaluating and Realigning United States Foreign Aid) came into force,



The document introduces a **90-day suspension of foreign development aid**, during which the effectiveness and alignment of aid with U.S. foreign policy will be assessed.



On January 24, U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio officially suspended the flow of foreign aid provided by the Department of State and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID)



PURPOSE OF THE SURVEY

Polish NGOs that depended on these funds began **receiving notifications regarding the need to halt their activities** due to a stop-work order from their partners.

In response to this situation, To Proste Foundation, NGO Forum "Together," and OFOP decided to investigate the impact of the freezing of U.S. funding for humanitarian and development programs on the Polish non-governmental sector.

A survey was sent on January 30, 2025, to a wide range of non-governmental organizations in Poland via the communication channels of OFOP, NGO Forum "Razem," and the Mapuj Pomoc Network – including newsletters and social media (Facebook and Instagram). The deadline for submitting responses was February 3, 2025. We collected responses until 5 February 2025.



RESPONDENT PROFILE

- The survey was completed by 38 non-governmental organizations, 23 of which operate in the area of humanitarian aid or migration. They were asked to provide answers to questions regarding issues such as:
 - sources and amounts of funding received for aid projects,
 - the method of communication regarding the stop-work order,
 - the organization's future plans following the sudden loss of financial liquidity.
- The main areas of activity for the organizations that participated in the survey are:
 - migration or humanitarian aid (23 responses),
 - education (17 responses),
 - promoting democracy and civil society (13 responses),
 - gender equality, women's rights, and support for the LGBT+ community (11 responses).
 - Other areas of the respondents' projects include supporting minorities, elderly people and those with disabilities, media and culture, and volunteering and combating peer violence.



RESPONDENT PROFILE








- **34 out of 38 survey respondents identified U.S. foreign aid as a source of funding for their activities.** The funding was provided through the following pathways:
 - 6 organizations received funding directly from the U.S. government and simultaneously through other entities (e.g., UN agencies or INGOs),
 - 28 respondents received indirect funding, including:
 - 12 organizations through an international non-governmental organization (INGO) or international program,
 - 16 organizations through UN agencies,



In the case of humanitarian and migration organisations, 20 respondents received US funding indirectly through: UN agencies, and an additional 2 organisations also received directly from the US government.



























Question 3a. If you receive funding from a UN agency, which one do you receive it from? (for humanitarian organizations and those working in the migration field)





PERCENT OF BUDGET


- The percentage that is represented by the frozen funds varies greatly between organisations. For 50% of respondents, the frozen funds represented half of their budget for activities in the first half of 2025.
 - 1,000,000 PLN and above 1,
 - from 400,000 PLN to 999,000 PLN 7,
 - from 100,000 PLN to 399,000 PLN 15,
 - from 40,000 PLN to 99,000 PLN 3,
 - below 40,000 PLN 5,
 - total: approximately 9,517,829.90 PLN.



For 40% of respondents, the frozen funds represented half of their budget for activities in the first half of 2025 - approximately 7 517 288,00 złotych.



MOST IMPORTANT NEEDS

When asked about the most important needs, 25 organizations indicated the necessity of ensuring the flow of information regarding the further actions of the U.S. government concerning the suspension of funding and oversight of U.S. foreign aid, as well as taking advocacy actions. 19 responses related to enabling dialogue with key partners.



All NGOs indicated the need of ensuring the flow of information on the further actions of the U.S. government regarding the suspension of funding a control of the US foreign aid. About three quarters of respondents indicated their need for advocacy actions. 19 responses concerned enabling dialogue with key partners.
