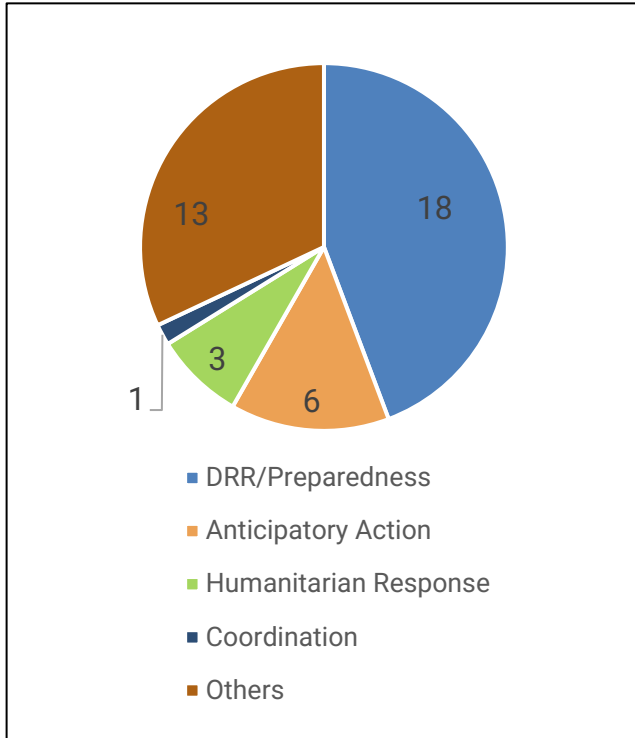

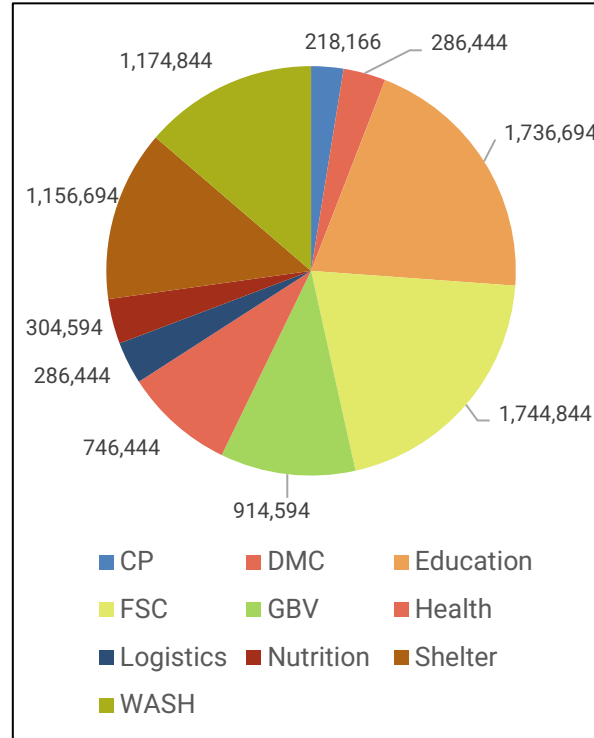

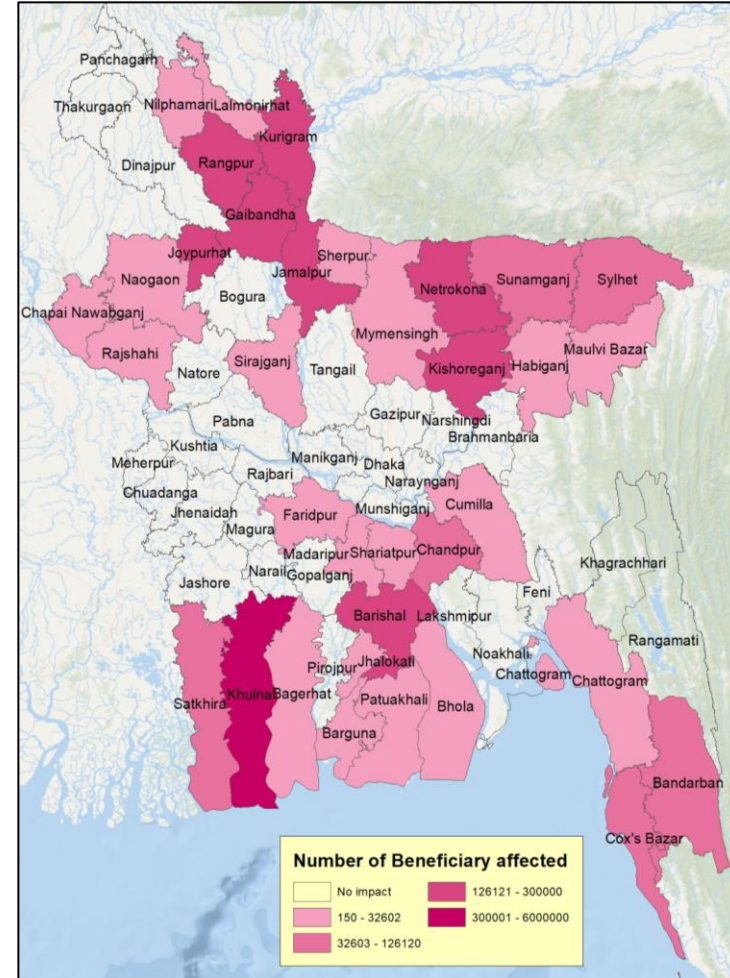
Fund Paused by nature of implementation phase (In USD million)

UNRCO conducted this survey (as of February 20, 2025) with members of the Inter-Cluster Coordination Group (ICCG) to analyze the impact of the US funding pause on Humanitarian Response, AA, and DRR/Preparedness. Please note that these findings do not reflect the entire situation in Bangladesh. The above chart shows the funding freeze due to the recent USAID stop order in Bangladesh, displaying the amount of frozen funds across different implementation phases. The 'Others' category includes various thematic areas such as Climate-Smart Agriculture, Community Resilience, Awareness Building, Local System Strengthening, Life Skills, Prevention of Human Trafficking, and more. Another chart illustrates the impact on each cluster due to the funding pause. The map shows the geographical concentration of impact based on the number of beneficiaries affected at the district level. About 35 districts have been impacted, with the northern, northeastern, and southern parts of Bangladesh being the most affected.
